<p>Camp Andrew Jackson</p> <p>March 16<sup>th</sup> 62</p> <p>My, Dear Aunt</p> <p>This will in form you that yours has ject come to hand Aunt I wrote to you since we got hear but I see that you hav not got it yet I hav nothing of importance only we ar all well at present we hav ject received marching orders I do not know wher we <del>can</del> ar going without it</p> <p>is to see if we cant find the rebels, Aunt I do not know when I will write a gain though it my be the last time I may write but if I nevr I hope that I will meet you all in a land wher we will never part.</p> <p>PS Aunt I wrote to you some tame ago I told you that I sent Uncle Jim ten dollars by Mr Hitt and I told you to send one dollar worth of postage stamps be shore to send</p> <p>them for I am out now <del>so</del> I cant writ eny more leters if you don't send them write soon and giv me all of the nuse</p> <p>yours Amos G. Mount Camp Andrew Jackson</p>	<p>The 6<sup>th</sup> left Camp Andrew Jackson on March 17 for Savannah to reinforce Gen.
